It has been 40 years since The Jewish Foundation of Manitoba was established with a founding gift of approximately 294 acres.

Since then, our community has changed dramatically as familiar institutions have closed their doors, changed their names, amalgamated and moved, in response to ever changing demographics and needs.

Throughout this time, the Foundation has flourished; accumulating almost \$47 million in its endowment fund and distributing more than \$20 million from the income on that fund.

Today, our Foundation continues to support, serve and shape the Winnipeg Jewish community and beyond, demonstrating undeniably that the legacy of its founders proudly lives on.

They were immigrants and first generation Canadians, physicians and lawyers, entrepreneurs and civil servants, middle aged and elderly, Zionists and Yiddishists, recreational golfers and champion chess players, football fans and opera buffs, family men and bachelors, world-travelers and Winnipeg boosters, monument builders and city planners, club founders and synagogue presidents, Negev Dinner honourees and honorary degree holders, Queen's Council appointees and Order of Canada recipients.

By 1964 they were all as well dedicated leaders of the Winnipeg Jewish community, men who had devoted time, money and their talents to the betterment of the community; men who shared the desire to guarantee the community a vibrant, viable and financially healthy future.

Most importantly, they were the men who were inspired by the vision of Joseph Halprin, Sam Werier and Abe Werier, and like them, donated founding gifts and lent their signatures to the establishment of The Jewish Foundation of Manitoba.
