



SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

JUDAIC STUDIES AND/OR STUDIES IN ISRAEL

DEADLINE - MARCH 31ST

Awarded to students who are in need of financial assistance to attend a university, college, post-graduate, or summer program in Judaic studies and/or an educational institution in Israel. This award is based on financial need, academic achievement and community involvement.

To be eligible for an award for Judaic studies and/or studies in Israel, an applicant:

A QUALIFIED CANDIDATE WILL...

- ...be applying for, have been accepted into, or be continuing studies in a university, college, post-graduate or summer program in Judaic studies and/or an educational institution in Israel
- ...Must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the selection committee that they are in need of financial assistance in order to pursue the program *
- ... Must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 or 'C' average
- ... Must be a resident of Manitoba

Assuming the applicant meets the eligibility requirements set forth above, the following criteria will be used by the selection committee in recommending an award:

- Financial need
- Academic achievement
- Involvement in the local community
- Volunteer work in the Jewish community
- Volunteer work in the general community
- The nature and length of the program to which the applicant has applied or been accepted
