
Winnipeg Jewish Theatre

16 Students Need Your Help

Gray Academy of Jewish Education

“We are asking for \$20,000 to assist 16 students who have limited resources and are not able to pay tuition fees.”

They are seeking support for families with high financial needs and extenuating circumstances. These are families who may be living below the poverty line, living in accessible or transitional housing, or be experiencing extreme financial situations.

A Student Needs Your Help

Jewish Child and Family Service

“We are asking for \$5,000 to send a foster youth to the Gray Academy of Jewish Education.”

Each year, Gray Academy generously and significantly reduces the tuition for foster children at JCFS. However, tuition and the costs of additional programming, field trips, and equipment is assessed at approximately \$5,000 for the school year. The cost of providing this type of education is borne entirely by JCFS as the child welfare system does not provide any supplemental funding to attend a private school of any kind, even for religious or cultural reasons.

Your support will ensure that the educational and cultural needs of JCFS’s Jewish foster children are met.

12 Children Need Your Help

Jewish Child and Family Service

“We are asking for \$10,000 to finance the specialized therapy services and supports for children living with Autism.”

Each year, the Settlement Program at JCFS is approached by families whose children present with specific therapy needs. There are always children on the newcomer caseload living with Autism, who have experienced trauma in Israel because of terrorism, or with a diagnosed health issue – all of which require specialized therapy services and supports. Although some degree of service is available through our health system, these come with very long waitlists and, if sought out privately, additional costs of these services are not covered. These critical supports are not affordable for these families.

Your support will offset costs for children requiring physiotherapy, speech-language services, as well as provide beneficial programming such as counselling, music therapy, and play therapy.



15 Seniors Need Your Help

Jewish Child and Family Service

“We are asking for \$10,000 to support vulnerable seniors who cannot afford the essentials needed for a dignified quality of life.”

Each year JCFS assists a small number of vulnerable clients who cannot afford private insurance to offset the costs of medical equipment not covered by government programs. Without essentials; including bath aides, scooters, wheelchairs, walkers and hearing aids, their independence and quality of life suffer. JCFS assesses their client's circumstances and assists them financially to obtain the necessary medical-related items.

Your support will enable JCFS to meet the needs of frail seniors and significantly enhance their quality of life, giving them the dignity and independence every person deserves.

50 Seniors Need Your Help

Gwen Sector Creative Living Centre

“We are asking for \$5,000 to ensure seniors in financially-challenged situations are able to attend social programs.”

Much like camperships for kids, the Seniors' Program Subsidy is for elderly individuals living on a fixed income. Over the last few years, Gwen Sector has found that an increasing number of seniors want to come to programming at the Centre but due to financial stresses, are unable to attend. These seniors find themselves having to prioritize essentials like food and electricity, with little or nothing left to put towards their social well-being. These limitations are the main contributor to the growing number of isolated seniors in our community.

Your support of the Seniors' Program Subsidy will assist those in financially-challenged situations to attend much-needed exercise, social and cultural programs, such as Friday Shabbat programming.
