After three years, the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba Luncheon in support of the Women's Endowment Fund returns to the calendar Friday, May 12, 2023, at the RBC Convention Centre Winnipeg.

We are thrilled to welcome our keynote speaker for the 2023 JFM Luncheon, Jim Estill, CEO of Danby Appliances and renowned philanthropist. Jim's ongoing work with refugees from Syria, Ukraine, and many other war-torn countries is second to none. Believing that we can all do something to improve our community, no matter the scale, Jim is taking steps daily to help improve the lives of those around him.

We recently sat down with Jim to ask him a few questions about his philosophies on philanthropy and making an impact.

You've now helped settle hundreds of refugee families in Canada. Can you describe your feelings when the first family touched down in Canada?

In 2015 I could see what was happening on the news, which caused me angst. I started thinking, 'what could I do to do something?' Of course, I would want to stop the war, but that is beyond my capability. I learned Canada has a private refugee sponsorship program, so I found out I could sponsor refugees and started doing that. It took over two years for the first families to arrive, so there was a lot of hurry up and wait. When the first families came, seeing the smiles on people's faces felt so good. They were so relieved and so happy to be here, and it filled my heart with warmth. through the list. We keep up with the families and see how they are doing. It's supporting people through a hard time. During that first month, it's intense, but after that, it all eases off.

If people are hesitant and think, "what impact can I really make?" How would you respond to that?

The key is that everyone should give within their means. Whatever is meaningful for a person is meaningful for them, and does their part. It doesn't matter what cause it's for; you should give something back. Everyone in Canada is exceptionally fortunate; we wake up in the morning in a safe place. We are all blessed, and giving back some of what we have, no matter the scale, gives us a feeling like nothing else can. Don't be shy about how much you can contribute. Do something on your scale.

Recently, you posted the following quote: "Your purpose in life is to find your purpose and give your whole heart and soul to it." – Gautama Buddha. Would you say you've found your purpose?

I have spent a lot of time on purpose. My purpose in life is to help as many people as possible achieve their greatest potential. Recognizing that as my purpose filters how Coming to speak to people as I will at the Foundation luncheon helps me accomplish that. If I talk to 100 people, I hope that those 100 people will leave with the inspiration to do just a little bit more.

What do you hope that attendees take away from your keynote at the luncheon?

I will be successful as a speaker if people change one thing they're doing. It can be now or any time down the road. That is done through true inspiration. I won't give you the secret now, but I will share the secret of happiness at the luncheon. I believe that if people come and learn this secret, they will, in turn, lead happier lives.

Tell us about your continued efforts with these families after they arrive.

It is vital that families are properly settled. Things like: finding a dentist, finding a doctor, registering the kids for school, getting bus passes, riding the bus with them and showing them around the city. Nothing can be missed, so we have a long checklist that we go through every time. For each family we bring in, we have four or five mentor families who work I spend my time and energy. To achieve my goals, I also need to expand my platform.

GRAY ACADEMY ESTABLISHES ENDOWMENT IN STUDENT'S MEMORY

"Do you see the face? I know I can. A face that's filled by colours who create a representation of myself at hard times of medications withdrawals. When I look at the beauty of a soul, personality is very obvious."

Those were the words of Ben Ben Chimol, a grade 12 student at Gray Academy of Jewish Education who lost his battle with cancer on December 1, 2022.

Ben's parents, Tatiana and David, along with Gray Academy, have been working since then to put together a way to honour his memory. A way to spotlight the brightness he brought to the lives of anyone who met him.

In March 2023, the Ben Ben Chimol^{2"1} Simchat Chayim Fund was launched at the Foundation, a new fund within Gray Academy's endowment. Income from this fund will be used for programs in the school that bring joy to others, something Ben did on a daily basis. The fund is a way for students to share their passions and celebrate their achievements.

Ben's passion for art was second to none, which is evident when anyone sees his paintings.

His kindness and perspective on life were beyond that of a high school student, something that his writing reflects beautifully. At a school-wide memorial on the day the fund launched, Ben's friends and sister spoke to their classmates, and each shared the same portrait of who he was; someone who listened, cared, and would make you smile at the drop of a dime.

"What about the future? Will I live? Will I succeed? Will I keep my personality? For those questions, I have an answer, but the understanding of my answer can only be described by a smoke screen who presents uncertainty of the future. That's why I am Ben Ben, a Better Ben Ben, to be a Better Ben Ben."

As part of the launch, Gray Academy held its Casual Day for A Cause, with donations going to the new fund.

Through Gray Academy's efforts, the fund reached \$5,000 in the first three days, halfway to its initial goal.

A Focus on Reconciliation

JFM TAKES PART IN TURTLE ISLAND PROJECT BLANKET EXERCISE

Upon his retirement from government, Clayton Sandy joined the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, allowing him to hear the stories of many indigenous people across Canada. Many high-profile people attended these conferences, ranging from former prime ministers and governors general to media personalities.

At one of the conferences, Sandy had a chance to chat with a former prime minister of Canada who explained to him that now, as a retired politician, he was sitting and listening to the stories from residential school and 60's scoop survivors for the first time. Much to his disappointment and frustration, he was not aware what the schools were truly about. "It's an opportunity for people to start healing," Sandy explains. "The reconciliation part is on the shoulders of the Canadian public; they must start hearing and accepting these stories. They don't have to do anything, just listen, and acknowledge that it happened."

"We want them not only to hear the history but the story of our resurgence and the plan for our future," says Sandy. "We provide examples of role models in our community and show a path for the next generation of our people to make it clear that we are succeeding everywhere you look." by the Jewish Foundation's Endowment Book of Life kiosk. They were thrilled and amazed at the collection of stories there and felt an immediate connection between our culture and theirs.

Every person in every community has a story. Each story is unique to its teller, though we find common themes throughout them. Themes of laying the foundations of family, overcoming atrocities to create a better future for the next generations, and themes of love and the feelings that bond us with our kin.

The indigenous community is no different. Their stories are full of colour and rich with tradition. We simply need to ask to hear them.

This got the wheels turning in his head.

Sandy gathered up a few of his friends, and they spent the next two years developing the Turtle Island Project blanket exercise. The exercise takes its participants through history, and is broken down into three parts: the first 150 years after contact, the resurgence of indigenous culture, and a group-sharing experience. A sharing circle concludes the program. Sandy explains that the goal is to make the space as safe as possible, where people can share their stories, ask questions, and learn together.

Recently the staff of the Jewish Foundation participated in the Turtle Island Project blanket exercise, a crucial "listening" step to reconciliation.

GRANT HELPS SIMKIN CENTRE PROVIDE SPIRITUAL CARE TO RESIDENTS

In 2021, the JFM provided a grant to the Saul and Claribel Simkin Centre for a Spiritual Care Aid.

"I know how important spiritual care is in our type of setting," says Laurie Cerqueti, Simkin Centre CEO. "For our residents, our families, and our community."

Since she took over the CEO role, Laurie's thoughts have been directed to 'How can we serve our people even more than we are now? How can we make this bigger and better?'

This sparked the idea that someone should be brought in to look at what they were doing regarding spiritual care to see where gaps and opportunities lay to develop the program.

The Simkin Centre hired Rabbi Matthew Leibl as the person to fill the role, someone Cerqueti thinks will be a perfect fit for what they're hoping to do.

Beginning in April, immediately after Passover, Rabbi Leibl will first spend time getting to know the residents, their families, and the staff at the Simkin Centre while looking at the processes and programs currently in place regarding spiritual care.

"As I spoke with Matthew about this opportunity, we see it as an opportunity to make a significant difference for the residents and their families," says Cerqueti.

Initially the timing was not right. With two young sons at home, Matthew was not looking to begin working again until 2023. But knowing that he was the right person for the role, the Simkin Centre deferred the project and the grant to wait for Matthew to be available.

This interaction with the Simkin Centre is not Rabbi Leibl's first. He has been involved with the Simkin Centre for over 15 years, first working there at age 21. That year, he did concerts three times per week for the residents.

"I found that the music and performing was an incredible way to connect with the people there," says Rabbi Leibl.

He recalls a story from that time frame where he was performing Oseh Shalom, and one resident who had been, to that point, without her memory and less present, began to mouth the words along with him. The song helped her break through what she had been dealing with.

"That moment was truly a game changer for me. I'm so excited to be able to give back to a place that helped people in my own family and was a great place for me while I was figuring out my way many years ago," says Rabbi Leibl. "Simkin is such a special place, and what they're doing there is awesome."

The Foundation is proud to support what we are sure will be an incredibly powerful and positive addition to the programming at the Simkin Centre.

Women's Endowment Fund Grants

In December 2022, the Board of Directors of the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba approved the following Women's Endowment Fund grants. The Women's Endowment Fund supports organizations and services that improve the lives of girls and women – of all backgrounds – in Manitoba.

Gowns for Grads Inc - \$5,000

Gowns for Grads will order and purchase 75 new evening dresses in sizes 18-28 from Hush Collection in Winnipeg. These sizes are rarely received as donations, yet 38% of the students who participate in the program, require these sizes.

Gwen Secter Creative Living Centre -\$5,000

To fund Snow Blowing for Bubbie. A program to assist single and widowed women living in their homes struggling with safely removing snow. One of the top concerns expressed to Gwen Secter is the safety of women getting in and out of their homes during winter. *Health Sciences Centre Foundation - \$35,000* To equip HSC to provide equal and equitable care to all women who require emergency Gynecological Surgery in Manitoba. A new software system and specialized equipment will make minimally invasive surgeries possible at HSC for after-hours emergencies.

Indigenous Family Centre - \$10,000 Parenting with Presence is a 6-week wellness program for mothers that promotes self-esteem, emotional awareness, coping skills and personal resilience through equine movement or horse therapy. Taking Charge! - \$8,000

To provide the participants at **Taking Charge!** with access to Elders from the Indigenous community who can provide teachings and spiritual counselling. Funds will be used to ensure participants can attend community cultural events they would not otherwise have access to.
